 - a. Fredericks motioned to approve minutes; second by Fairbanks

IV. President's Remarks

- a. Fairbanks appreciates all of the work that Representatives have done so far.
- b. Campus Assembly is tomorrow at 4:30 in the Science Auditorium.
- c. Laddie Arnold will now be a member of Campus Assembly.
- d. We have a very busy second half of the semester planned. Please respond to MCSA emails. They contain very important information regarding MCSA events and committees.

- f. Forum on November 18th will be a Pizza Ranch fundraiser. Attendance will still be taken.
- V. For Information: Organization Meetings *Presented by Executive Assistant Sunderman*
 - a. Sunderman noted that Representatives will be required to attend organization meetings throughout the semester.
 - b. Sunderman will be assigning all members of Forum to organizations. Forum members will be required to check in with Sunderman after attending their assigned meetings.

- a. MCSA has about 3,000 dollars in their bank account.
- b. We are still waiting to hear whether or not Support the U Day transportation will be covered.
- VII. For Action: Approval of \$100 MPIRG Co-Sponsorship for Renewable Re-Purposing Forum *Presented by Secretary Wolf*
 - a. Fredericks moved to approve MPIRG Co-Sponsorship; second by Wealot
 - b. Wolf noted that she was approached over Fall Break about a possible cosponsorship. Money will be going toward pizza, and MPIRG has asked for additional dollars to cover advertising.
 - c. Schroeder noted that pizza has already been purchased for this event.
 - d. Baglio noted that co-sponsorships in the past have split the bill equally between both parties, and Baglio does not feel comfortable with MCSA covering the entire bill.
 - e. Wolf responded by stating that MPIRG did not inform her that the bill would not be split.
 - f. Fairbanks noted that she really likes that MCSA is co-sponsoring with MPIRG, but believes that MPIRG should think about paying advertising costs.
