Clark Terry

Jazzman Clark Terry has been called “the Merlin of the mouthpiece, the playful prestidigitator of the trumpet and flugelhorn.” Terry has heard and played a lot of jazz. Late night TV fans remember him performing with Skitch Henderson’s and Doc Severinsen’s “Tonight Show” orchestra. Terry played with Count Basie and was featured soloist with Duke Ellington’s orchestra for eight years.

Terry “attended the University of Ellingtonia” during his total of 10 years with Duke Ellington’s orchestra. When performing at a St. Louis area night club many years ago, one of his listeners was a fledgling horn player hoping to get a few pointers. That youngster was Miles Davis, later to be one of the brightest stars in the jazz galaxy.

Terry has been enchanting fans with his showman’s trunk of tricks for over 40 years. An articulate and affable musician, he is well-known and loved by the great jazz musicians throughout the world.



Don Menza

Don Menza is a native of Buffalo, New York. He is well-schooled as a reed player but basically self-taught as a composer, and is one of the busiest musicians of today. His first plaudits came long before today in the form of "Best Tenor" and "Best Soloist" awards at the Notre Dame Collegiate Festival.

Don was soon with the Maynard Ferguson Orchestra, recording, playing and writing several of the recorded charts for Maynard.

Following was a short stint with Stan Kenton and then to Europe for four years where at the 1st Montreux Jazz Festival, he won top honors. Upon his return to the states, Don joined forces with Buddy Rich for whom he has scored many musical successes. Don's charts have also become a major contribution to the Louie Bellson Big Band library.

Don Menza can be found in almost every major motion picture, TV and recording studio in Los Angeles. In addition, he's often heard in local jazz clubs as well as jazz clubs across the United States, Canada, and Europe.

A reed switch-hitter, his main horn is the tenor, and his versatility, composing talents and original teaching methods have made him a much sought-after clinician.
