Lake Region Arts Council, Spring Legacy Arts & Cultural Heritage Grants

Lake Region Arts Council's Legacy grant programs are based on the three key areas of Arts Access, Arts Education, and Arts & Cultural Heritage.

Deadline: March 3, 2022

Imagine Fund Arts, Design, and Humanities Chair Awards

The provost has established two University Imagine Fund chairs (one per two-year cycle), each a two-year award during which the recipient becomes a Chair of Arts, Design, and Humanities. During each two-year term, the faculty awardee receives up to \$100,000 to work with a group of faculty, staff, students, and other collaborators to create a program of activities for the University community and the community at large. The goal of these projects is to incite cross-departmental, multi-campus, and collaborative work.

The Whitehall Foundation assists scholarly research in the life sciences through its research grants and grants-in-aid programs. Supports dynamic areas of basic biological research that are not heavily supported by federal agencies or other foundations with specialized missions. The foundation emphasizes the support of young scientists at the beginning of their careers and productive senior scientists who wish to move into new fields of interest.

Jerome Hill Artist Fellowships

Jerome Hill Artist Fellowships support Minnesota and New York City-based artists across 8 artistic fields who generate new work that takes creative risks in expanding, questioning, experimenting with or re-imagining conventional artistic forms. This Fellowship supports artists who embrace their roles as part of a larger community of artists and citizens, and consciously work with a sense of service, whether aesthetic, social or both. Support is directed to artists who are at an early point in their careers in creating such work, generally in their 2nd–10th year as a generative artist.

Humanities Initiatives at Colleges and Universities strengthen the teaching and study of the humanities at institutions of higher education by developing new humanities programs, resources (including those in digital format), or courses, or by enhancing existing ones. Projects must be organized around a core topic or set of themes drawn from such areas of study in the humanities as history, philosophy, religion, literature, and composition and writing skills. NEH welcomes applications for projects that are modest in scope, duration, and budget, as well as applications for expansive, long-term projects.
