I. Minutes

Holly made a motion to approve the minutes of the November 7, 2012, meeting, Barry seconded. Motion was approved (8-0-0).

II. 10 Hour Work Study Cap

Jill Beauregard informed the committee that the ten hour work study cap has been a UMM policy for as long as anyone can remember. Student time sheets are locked out after the student has worked 20 hours in a pay period. The student must contact Carol Backman in this case. The committee was reminded that there are limited work study funds available for students. It was also mentioned that some departments do have their own funds for student employment.

III. Student Conduct Code

Henry Fulda presented the new Student Conduct Code that was approved by the Board of Regents on October 11, 2012, and went into effect on January 1, 2013. Henry went over all of the sections of the code and noted where changes were made.

IV. On-campus/Off-campus Percentage

T. J. Ross presented the committee with information on the number of students that can be housed in each of the residence halls and apartment. Currently UMM does not have a requirement for students to reside in on-campus housing. It was noted that 95% of 1st year students do however live on campus without being required to do so.
