Homecoming Planned For October 17

This is the "Year of the Cat"! So track on down to Cougar Country, the University of Minnesota, Morris, for this year's exciting Homecoming events, Oct. 16-18.

Homecoming festivities commence Friday, Oct. 16 at 6 p.m., the Cougar's favorite time of day, when the annual Cougar pepfest and bonfire will be held on Cougar Hill, behind the UMM P.E. Center. Cougar action begins shortly thereafter, as UMM's dedicated volleyball team takes on the College of St. Catherine at 7 p.m. in the P.E. Center.

Alumni are advised to sleep well Friday evening, as Saturday's events begin early. At 9 a.m., in the Behmler Hall Conference Room, all UMM alums are invited to join the Cougar at the Alumni Association's Annual Meeting. This year's agenda includes, among Homecoming announcements, the installation of new officers, recognition of outgoing Board members, and the revision of the present constitution.

As pumpkins ripen in outlying fields, the Cougar will stroll downtown for the 10:30 a.m. Annual Homecoming Parade, which begins at East Side Park and winds its way past fans along Atlantic Avenue and back toward the campus.

An amiable animal, Frederick J. Cougar may pause following the parade for the Alumni Association Pre-Game Huddle at Grady's on Atlantic, 410 Atlantic Avenue (in the heart of beautiful downtown Cougartown). Beginning at 11 a.m., this event promises fellowship with old friends, families of UMM athletes, and the chance to meet familiar and new faculty and staff, in addition to mouth-watering sandwiches from Grady's full menu. F. J. Cougar may quench his thirst, too, as he quaffs beverages with happy hour prices for this special alumni get-together.



F. J. reminds Cougar fans that should they wish to purchase a special pennant, tam, or Cougar memento to bring or wear to the game and later events, the UMM Bookstore, located in the Community Services Building on campus, will be open Saturday from 11 a.m. - 1 p.m., as well as for an hour after the game in the afternoon.

At 1:30 p.m., wearing the unsoiled maroon jersey, the UMM Cougars, under head coach Dick Smith, will take the field and tangle with the Winona State Warriors. Buoyed by the support of local Cougar fans, the team is expecting success. Alums will also get the chance to see special half-time entertainment provided by the Cougarette danceline and the honorary Homecoming Band.

Following this annual contest (and with no need, of course, to sulk or to lick wounds), F. J. will stop by the Division of Science and Mathematics Alumni "Speakerless Colloquium," 3:30 p.m. - 6:30 p.m. at the Frontier Lounge, Sunwood Inn, Highway 28 in Morris. A popular companion, F. J. will nevertheless offer his goodbyes and pad on over to join the throng of Cougar alums at the home of Jack

and Lucy Imholte, 506 East Third Street, Morris, for the annual Provost's Post-Game Reception. (He knows that if he does not arrive promptly after the game, he will not find a parking place for his moped.) During this post-game period, some alums may also choose to attend Alumni Letter Club meetings at the P.E. Center. The Women's Letter Club will meet in Room 250; the Men's Club, in Room 251.

One of the Cougar's favorite lairs is the Sunwood Inn, site of Saturday evening's Alumni Reception, beginning at 7:30 p.m. The reception will feature a cash bar at the newly-redecorated poolside area, in addition to the Cougar Room (where else?) Film Fest and Memorabilia Exposition. (Alums are invited to call UMM at (612) 589-2211, ext. 6052 if they wish to make a contribution of nostalgic items or films.) The Film Fest is expected to include old movies of campus scenes and football games.

Finishing the day in good form and in good fashion, the Cougar is expected to put on his dancing shoes and swirl to the music of Johnny Holm and his Traveling Fun Show, the annual Homecoming Dance, at 8:15 p.m. in the campus P.E. Annex.

Turning to things cultural, the Cougar has plans for a great Homecoming Sunday. An exhibition of "Recent Works by Ruth Ann Olson" will be featured in the Gallery of UMM's Humanities Fine Arts Center, and at 3 p.m. in Edson Auditorium the UMM Concert Band and Concert Choir will present their annual Homecoming Concert. Plan to arrive early, as latecomers to these most popular concerts often find "standing room only."

Alums are encouraged to make early lodging reservations for this special Homecoming Weekend, Oct. 16-18. Make your plans now to track on down to Cougartown!



Alumni-Senior Picnic 1981

The UMM Alumni Association sponsored the 1981 Alumni-Senior Picnic for the 1981 seniors on May 28 at the Pomme de Terre Park in Morris. The reception, which attracted approximately 200 seniors, faculty and staff, is an annual event.

A highlight of this year's picnic was a performance by the UMM Jazz Combo II lead by UMM alumnus Jim Carlson (Class of 1965). Alumni Tom McRoberts (Class of 1968) and Maddy Maxeiner (Class of 1976) spoke to the seniors about the responsibilities and privileges of being a UMM alum.

Special guests in attendance included Provost Jack Imholte; Academic Dean Elizabeth Blake; the Division Chairmen and Alumni Secretary Pearl Johnson.

Your UMM Alumni Association Board of Directors provided a half-barrel of beer and other non-alcoholic beverages, food and assisted with promotion of the activity. The picnic was coordinated by the UMM Alumni Affairs Office.

Kaufman-McCree Awards Presented

Two University of Minnesota, Morris students have been honored as the first recipients of the Andrew J. Kaufman and A. Amos McCree awards. Initiated this year, the Kaufman and McCree awards will be presented annually to two UMM students who are majors in the natural and mathematical sciences, respectively.

The purpose of the awards is to recognize students displaying academic excellence and potential in these two areas of study. The Kaufman award for the natural sciences is presented in memory of Andrew J. Kaufman, father of Dr. Edward Kaufman of Appleton. The McCree Award for the mathematical sciences is presented in memory of A. Amos McCree, father of Mrs. Dorothybelle Kaufman of Appleton.

Edward and Dorothybelle Kaufman donated 190 shares of Minnesota Mining and Manufacturing Corp. (3M) stock to establish the awards. The gift, totaling \$10,283, will fund the annual awards.

Andrew J. Kaufman was born on a farm near Blue Earth, Minnesota in 1880. Throughout his life he main-

tained an interest in agriculture and related activities. He was a pioneer in the establishment and in the dispersal of both electric lighting and radio in western Minnesota.

A. Amos McCree was born in Scotland in 1883. He earned his College of Engineering degree from the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities in 1908. He was engaged in engineering and contracting throughout his professional career.

To qualify for the awards, a student must have completed a minimum of 90 credits of academic work, and must be pursuing a degree on a full-time basis; must be majoring in a discipline within the Division of Science and Mathematics; and must have a minimum grade point average of 3.0 ("B").

Lynda M. McDowell, junior from Beaver Creek is the 1980-81 recipient of the Andrew J. Kaufman award, and Richard V. Atkinson, junior from Freeport, is the recipient of the 1980-81 A. Amos McCree award.

The award recipients and nominee were honored at a special luncheon held on the UMM campus May 20.

Kemble Addresses Paris Conference

UMM psychologist Ernest D. Kemble is one of 60 psychologists from around the world invited to participate in a prestigious conference at the Castle of Fillerval, about 50 miles from Paris, France, this fall. The September Conference is entitled "The Amygdala Revisited," and papers presented at the symposium will be compiled into a book of the same title to be published by Elsevier North Holland. Kemble, author of numerous papers on amygdaloid research, will address the topic of "Effects of Amygdaloid Lesions on Some Species' Typical Behavior" in his presentation.

At UMM Kemble is known as a challenging teacher who frequently involves students in his work. In the past 14 years he has co-authored more than 20 published studies with his students, thus offering undergraduate students in psychology an opportunity often reserved for graduate students. Valued by students as a friend as well as teacher, he was nominated for and received the University-wide Horace T. Morse-Amoco Foundation Award for Outstanding Contributions to Undergraduate Education at UMM in 1977.

The trip to Europe this fall will be a first for Ernie and his wife, Kathy. They look forward to a week preceding the conference to explore England and France.

Alumni Contribute to Scholarship Fund

UMM Alumni contributed generously during this past year to the third annual Freshman Academic Scholarship Program fund drive. Alumni contributions totaled \$6,655 during the 1980-81 drive.

Business and individual contributions for the 1981 Freshman Academic Scholarship Program Fund Drive total \$7,905 and contributions from UMM faculty and staff total \$1,500. Though busy building solar homes with New Realities of Chisago City, Terryll is also working on a studio addition to his home in Shafer, MN. "Lawrence Creek Studio" will provide Terryll with the solitude and work space needed to paint watercolors and to sculpt. The studio will also serve as headquarters for Terryll's silk screen "to size" mail order business which he hopes to establish. Customers may order exact-sized plans from Terryll's catalogue, and will therefore be able to transfer their patterns directly onto dampened plywood without having to first redraw them to scale.

Meanwhile, back at the Terryll household, Stan and his wife, Claire (Campion) Terryll (1967), and daughters Kathy, 13; Sheila, 12; and Kelly, 8; are going to fly a kite. When they tire of flying their kite, they are going to roast hot dogs with it. The mylar kite, which Stan designed and displayed at the Inventors' Congress last year, makes a parabolic reflector capable of focusing enough sunlight to cook food. Daughters Kathy and Sheila have joined the kite making act and won several contests to net them cash and bicycles.

Stan recently took his kite flying expertise to Roseville, MN, where he taught a summer school course for high potential students at Summer Academy III. The course, entitled, "Those Magnificent Students and Their Flying Machines," was designed to expand the students' knowledge of flight and aerodynamic theory, using Frank E. William's

model for implementing cognitive-affective behaviors in the classroom, and Bloom's Taxonomy. What that really means, according to Terryll, is that they built flying model airplanes, kites, and hot air balloons.

In his free time, Stan is the set designer for the Masquers Theatre Company in Forest Lake, MN., and is a bird counter with the Chisago County Audubon Society. Claire does child protection social work for Chisago County.

Louie's Lower Level to House New Computer Center

Appropriations from the Minnesota Legislature will be used to transform the former Louie's Lower Level into suitable housing for UMM's new computer center. A bonding bill passed late in the 1980-81 session included \$320,000 for remodeling the lower floor of Behmler Hall.

The remodeled area in Behmler will provide the new computer center with such essential features as an uninterruptible power system and a number of special-purpose rooms with temperature and humidity control. The new area will also provide room for expansion to meet the increasing needs of campus users.

Computer Center Director Andy Lopez estimates that during the past three years, use of computer facilities for computer science courses and instructional purposes has increased by about 30% per year. The expanded facilities will enable the computer center to better meet campus instructional and administrative computer needs.

Summer Theatre Successful



UMM's first Summer Theatre program was considered a great success. The joint venture by the Division of Humanities and Continuing Education Summer Session, provided college students and summer session students of all ages and backgrounds with hands on experience in every aspect of theatre production. Over 1500 people attended performances of **Harvey** and **The Matchmaker**; the latter production played to a full house every night. A donation by the Alumni Association was used to help defray the costs of printing programs for the two comedies.

Because the summer theatre program was a success financially as well as programmatically, it is hoped that it will continue in the future.
