The Minutes for 23 January 2013 were approved with minor corrections.

The committee continued consideration of additional institutions for recommendation as part of UMM's peer group:

Albion College (Jim Barbour) **Verdict: MAYBE**

- Appears to be much like UMM. Ranked first in model #3.
- Enrollment 1382, BA and BFA, 105 full-time faculty
- Located in Albion, MI, pop. 9,000
- Research Valued

Central College (Jordan Wentz) **Verdict: NO**

- Some similarity, but strong religious mission
- 1500 students; \$39k tuition
- Majors offered are similar
- Not much evidence that research is valued

College of Charleston (Margaret Kuchenreuther) **Verdict: NO**

- 10,000 students, COPLAC, some research
- \$30k tuition
- 19 graduate programs

Coe College (Sarah Mattson) **Verdict: MAYBE**

- Strong similarity; \$41.9k tuition;
- "Selective"; 1400 students
- Presbyterian background
- Majors offered very similar to ours
- Good evidence that research is valued

College of New Jersey (Margaret) **Verdict: NO**

- 4600 students; graduate program

Cornell College (Margaret) **Verdict: NO**

- Discussed previously

Hanover College (Julie Eckerle) **Verdict: MAYBE**

- 1100 students; no graduate programs
- Research highly valued
- Excellent academics
- No English 101 classes or other 100 level college writing course – probably Writing across the Curriculum
- Located in Madison, OH

Lycoming College (Margaret) **Verdict: MAYBE**

- 1400 students; tuition \$41.5k
- BA, BS
- Emphasis on research
- Pretty much like us

Maryville College (Charlie Cain) **Verdict: NO**

- 1093 students
- Church affiliated
- Some BS degrees

Millsaps College (Michael Eble) **Verdict: NO**

- United Methodist Church connection
- 950 Students; Lots of religious studies

Ramapo College (Arne Kildegaard) **Verdict: MAYBE**

- COPLAC; 6000 students, 250 are graduate students
- Tuition is \$25k in-state, \$34k out-of-state
- Like us except for size
- Too big?

SUNY Geneseo (Margaret) **Verdict: NO**

- 5000 students with graduate program

Massachusetts College of Liberal Arts (Margaret) Verdict: MAYBE

- 1900 students
- BA, BS
- Tuition \$8525
- Obviously value research

Margaret will talk with Nancy Helsper about getting more information on these MAYBEs as well as other candidate colleges.
