# 2004 Guest Artists

## WAYNE BERGERON

Wayne's interest in music began in the 7<sup>th</sup> grade when he discovered his natural ability on the trumpet. His band director Ron Savitt heard Wayne's talent and helped guide the aspiring musician to his destiny as a professional trumpet player. By the age of 19, Wayne was touring and playing local gigs in Los Angeles. In 1986 he was lead trumpet player with the Maynard Ferguson Band. He can be heard on recordings such as "Body and Soul", "Big Bop Nouveau" and "Brass Attitude". According to Ferguson, "Wayne is the most musical lead trumpet player I've ever had on my band."

Bergeron has worked on over 250 TV and motion picture soundtracks, including: "Sweet Home Alabama", "Catch Me if You Can", "Eight Crazy Nights", "Big Fat Liar", "Queen of the Damned", "John Q.", "Master of Disguise", "American Pie 2", "Big Trouble", "15 Minutes", "Analyze This", "Scream 3", "The Kid", "South Park", "Flubber", "Ace Ventura", "The Hunchback of Notre Dame", "Meet Joe Black", and "Primary Colors". Wayne's trumpet solos can be heard on several movies including "High Crimes", "Aladdin King of Thieves" and "Return of Jafar".

Some of his numerous TV credits include shows such as American Idol, Dragnet, Emmy Awards, Jeopardy, and America's Funniest Home Videos. His trumpet solos can be heard on from King of the Hill, Boston Public and Sabrina the Teenage Witch. His credits also include hundreds of TV and radio jingles.

Wayne's passion for big bands has found him seated in some of LA's most well respected bands such as Quincy Jones, Bob Florence, Ralph Carmichael, Frank Capp and Bob Curnow, and numerous others.

Wayne is currently on staff at CSU Northridge where he manages to find time to teach privately. His skills have taken him to different parts of the globe as a clinician/soloist. Wayne annually performs in Switzerland at the Aarau Jazz Festival and has toured Japan as a guest soloist. In 1999 to celebrate Duke Ellington's birthday, Wayne had the honor of performing as the lead trumpeter and soloist for the Ellington Legacy Orchestra tour in Switzerland and Germany. In the spring of 2001 Wayne occupied the lead trumpet chair with the Benny Golson All Star Band in Switzerland. He has just released his first solo Big Band CD titled "You Call this a Living?" featuring L.A.'s finest musicians.



## KIM PARK

Kim Park is an internationally renowned and versatile Jazz Artist. In addition to performing on saxophone, flute, and piano, he is also a composer, producer, clinician and educator.

He is the son and protégé of the late John Park, the legendary lead alto saxophonist of the Stan Kenton Orchestra. Kim has performed around the world with Stan Kenton, Clark Terry, Louis Bellson, Stan Getz, George Benson, Mel Torme, Vic Damone, Phil Woods, Rob McConnell, Ray Brown, Four Freshmen, Manhattan Transfer and many others.

Kim has also been the featured soloist at both the National Flute and Saxophone Conventions, as well as the Kansas City, Atlanta and Tulsa Symphonies, plus the Santa Fe Chamber Music Festival.

## Jazz I to back Wayne Bergeron and Kim Park

The University of Minnesota, Morris currently has four Jazz Ensembles and numerous Jazz Combos. All of the UMM Jazz Ensembles tour every year, including biennial trips to New Orleans. UMM musicians have performed for many music conventions, including the MMEA convention in Minneapolis and the NCMENC in Chicago. They have also performed at a variety of functions including festivals, clinics, performing art series, and various other private events. In July of 1991, the UMM Jazz Ensemble was one of 25 big bands from around the world to perform at the 25th annual Montreux Jazz Festival in Montreux, Switzerland. During the Memorial Day Weekend of 1992, they performed at Carnegie Hall with The Count Basie Orchestra. In July of 1994 they performed in The North Sea Jazz Festival at The Hague, Netherlands. In the summer of 1997, the ensembles made return appearances at both Montreux and North Sea Jazz Festivals. In the summer of 2000, the UMM Jazz Ensembles performed at both the Montreux and Vienne, France Jazz Festival.
