"Animal Ethics, Wild and Domestic"

Professor Callicott is the author of *In Defense of the Land Ethic: Essays in Environmental Philosophy*, *Beyond the Land Ethic: More Essays in Environmental Philosophy*, *Earth's Insights*, *American Indian Environmental Ethics: An Ojibwa Case Study* (with Michael P. Nelson), and *Clothed-in-Fur and Other Tales: An Introduction to the Ojibwa World View* (with Thomas Overholt).
