WITH THE COMPLETION OF THAT WORK LAST SUMMER, THE DISCIPLINE NOW BELIEVES THAT ETHICAL AND CIVIC RESPONSIBILITY MORE ACCURATELY DESCRIBES THE FOCI OF THE COURSE. SPCH 2071 INCORPORATES PUBLIC SPEAKING, SMALL GROUP COMMUNICATION, AND INTERPERSONAL COMMUNICATION. BY CHANGING THE DESIGNATOR, THE COURSE WILL BE IN LINE WITH THE DESIGNATORS OF OTHER COURSES IN SPEECH COMMUNICATION EXPLORING PUBLIC SPEAKING.  
**Old:** SUPPORTED BY AN EDP GRANT, THIS COURSE IS DESIGNED TO MEET THE SPECIFIC NEEDS OF THOSE SEEKING LICENSURE IN COMMUNICATION ARTS/LITERATURE. THE COURSE COMBINES THE MATERIALS FOUND IN PUBLIC SPEAKING, INTERPERSONAL COMMUNICATION, AND INTRODUCTION TO GROUPS.
