(3) IT WILL COMPLEMENT OTHER SOCIAL SCIENCE COURSES BY PROVIDING A SOCIOLOGICAL PERSPECTIVE ON ENVIRONMENT AND DEVELOPMENT ISSUES EXAMINED WITHIN THOSE DISCIPLINES. (4) THE COURSE IS DESIGNED TO MEET PARTIAL REQUIREMENTS FOR THE BOTH THE ENVIRONMENTAL STUDIES AND THE GENDER, WOMEN, AND SEXUALITY STUDIES (GWSS) MAJORS.
