Accomplishments

Michael Ceballos, assistant professor of biology, and **Rachel Gibbons**, assistant professor of biology, received three awards in the fall grant round of the University of Minnesota Grant-in-Aid of Research, Artistry and Scholarship Program. **Ceballos** was awarded a \$38,381 New Assistant Professor GIA for his proposal titled *Epilepsy and Herpevirus Infection*. **Gibbons** was awarded a \$35,107 New Assistant Professor GIA for her proposal titled *Investigating the Influence of CD80/B7-H1 Signaling on Anti-Tumor Immune Responses Mediated by CD8+T Cells*. Together they were awarded a \$34,090 Shared Equipment GIA for the Acquisition of a BD Accuri C6 Flow Cytometer.

Melissa Weber, director of communications, and **Erin Christensen**, associate director of alumni relations and annual giving, presented at the <u>Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE) District V</u> conference in Chicago, Illinois, December 15-17, 2013. Their presentation, "Using a Collaborative Social Media Strategy for Small Shops," examined Morris's integrated and successful approach to social media.

Work by **J. Wesley Flinn**, assistant professor of music, was selected to appear on <u>WPRB 103.3 FM</u>'s end-of-year new music marathon. *Vegas Vespers* aired on December 28, 2013.

Troy Goodnough, sustainability director, has been awarded an <u>Institute on the Environment (IonE) Fall 2013 Mini Grant</u>. IonE Mini Grants are designed to encourage collaboration among faculty, staff and students across University of Minnesota disciplines, units, and campuses on environmental themes. The grant will support a student engagement leadership fellow who will advance the Student Engagement Workgroup of the Systemwide Sustainability Committee, help organize its 2013-14 leadership event, explore networking and communication relationship opportunities, and connect University student leaders with other Minnesota youth environmental leadership groups and networks.

In the News

Bart Finzel, vice chancellor for academic affairs and dean, is featured in the January 2014 issue of *Mpls.St.Paul* magazine. In "Study Here. Stay Here," Finzel discusses the importance of keeping Minnesota students in the state.

The Rural Arts and Culture Summit, sponsored by Springboard for the Arts and co-hosted by the **Center for Small Towns**, was featured on Pioneer Public Television's *Postcards* in January. In 2013 the summit brought together hundreds of artists and art administrators from throughout the upper Midwest to share stories about ways that the arts are revitalizing small towns. The program is now available for <u>online viewing</u>.

Alissa Jacobsen '12 was featured in a <u>story</u> by the *Pioneer Press* for inspiring her grandparents to transform their Oakdale property into a working farm. Jacobsen was involved in a similar project at Morris.

The University of Minnesota's Next Generation Environmental Leaders are highlighted in the December 2013 <u>Sustainability: Journal of Record</u>. These students from the Morris and Twin Cities campuses received the <u>Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education (AASHE) Student Sustainability Leadership Award</u> last fall.
