# Accomplishments

**Mike Vandenberg '03**, assistant director of admissions, received the <u>Distinguished Service Award for the</u> <u>Minnesota Association for College Admissions Counseling</u> (MACAC). This award is given to one candidate per year. Candidates who have spent more than five years in MACAC are chosen based on contributions to the organization and its programs and for making a difference in the lives of students.

**Barbara Burke**, associate professor of communication, media, and rhetoric, presented at the Forum on Higher Education in Valmiera, Latvia. Burke spoke about how Americans promote the value of a university education for young people while meeting the needs of the future for regional communities.
