Accomplishments

Stephen Burks, associate professor of economics and management, has been appointed to a three-year term as the chair of the standing technical committee <u>AT060</u>, Trucking Industry Research, at the <u>Transportation Research Board</u> (TRB). The TRB is a division of the National Research Council of the United States, which is administered by the National Academy of Science, the National Academy of Engineering, and the Institute of Medicine and is charged to provide the government with independent advice on scientific and technical questions.

Michelle Page, associate professor of secondary education, will present at the <u>2014 Annual Meeting of the American Educational Research Association</u> April 3–7 in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania. Page will present "<u>Many</u>

Strands Are Not Easily Broken: A Portrait of LGBT Inclusion." The conference theme is "The Power of Education Research for Innovation in Practice and Policy."

In the News

The **University of Minnesota**, **Morris** was mentioned in a recent <u>article</u> by the *Wall Street Journal*. Last week Minnesota regulators approved 29 renewable energy projects to receive \$42 million in grants from Xcel Energy's Renewable Development Fund, and Morris is listed as the site of an intended research and development project.

Stephen Burks, associate professor of economics and management, was quoted in the March 3 issue of *Transport Topics*, the national trade press journal published by the American Trucking Associations. The story discusses initiatives by the United States Department of Transportation to increase the data collected on the trucking industry by doing a new version of one important study and by bringing back two data collection efforts cancelled under prior administrations. Burks is quoted as being in favor of these initiatives in his new role as chair of the standing technical committee AT060, Trucking Industry Research, at the Transportation Research Board.
