Accomplishments

Kari Hanson '14 has been accepted to the <u>Carnegie Mellon Summer School in Logic and Formal Epistemology</u> for summer 2014. Its goals are to introduce promising students to cross-disciplinary fields of research at an early stage in their careers and to forge lasting links between the various disciplines. The summer school will be held June 2–20.

Natalie Hoidal '15, Forest Lake, and **Katie Ledermann '17**, Mahtomedi, provided the keynote speech at the Iron Range Earth Fest on April 26, 2014, in Mountain Iron. They discussed the important role of youth in creating change in Minnesota and some of their current Next Generation organizing efforts.

Stephen Burks, associate professor of economics and management, presented "Social Preferences in the Lab and in the Field: Evidence from Townspeople, College Students, and Truckers" as part of the research seminar series sponsored by the Center for Human Resources and Labor Studies (CHRLS) at the Carlson School of Management at the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities (UMTC), on Friday, May 2. The work presented was jointly created by Burks, Jon Anderson, professor of statistics, M. Bombyk '10, J. Carpenter, Middlebury College, C. DeYoung, UMTC, D. Ganzhorn '08, L. Götte, University of Lausanne, K. Maurer '10, Iowa State University, D. Nosenzo, University of Nottingham, R. Potter '13, K. Rocha '11, and A. Rustichini, UMTC.

Michael Lackey, associate professor of English, will discuss his latest book, <u>Truthful Fictions: Conversations with American Biographical Novelists</u>, on Wednesday, May 21, at 6:30 p.m. at the Morris Public Library (102 East 6th Street, Morris, MN 56267). Lackey interviewed 16 of the country's most prominent biographical novelists in order to determine why this genre of fiction came into being and what it is able to do. At this event, he will share some of his discoveries about the biographical novel, which skillfully blends fact and fiction.

Jayne Blodgett, assistant library director, and **Peter Bremer**, reference coordinator, were presenters at the conference of the Academic & Research Library Division of the Minnesota Library Association in Chaska on April 25. Their presentation, "It's All Fun and Games (in an Academic Library)," described Briggs Library's efforts to engage students in a fun and creative way and to reach out to students who may not have ventured into the library.
