Accomplishments

Managing Director of the White House Council on Environmental Quality Christy Goldfuss and U.S. Secretary of Education Arne Duncan announced today that the **University of Minnesota**, **Morris** is among the 2015 U.S. Department of Education Green Ribbon Schools Postsecondary Sustainability Awardees. Morris is one of nine postsecondary recipients this year, the first in which institutions of higher education have been eligible.

Work by **Satis Devkota**, assistant professor of economics, has been accepted for publication in the *Journal of Human Development and Capabilities*. The article, "What Factors Change Education Inequality in Nepal?", also has been published on <u>Taylor & Francis Online</u>. This research was done in collaboration with Professor Mukti Upadhyay of Eastern Illinois University.

Ray Schultz, professor of theatre arts, recently performed a leading role in T.S. Eliot's *Murder in the Cathedral* for Compass Rose Theatre in the Washington, DC, area. *The Capital Gazette* called his performance "powerful and true." Schultz also brought his solo performance as Tennessee Williams in *Blanche and Beyond: Letters of Tennessee Williams* to the Loudoun campus of Northern Virginia Community College. Since 2012 he has toured the production to various colleges and theatres throughout the country.

"Cognitive Skills, Personality, and Economic Preferences in Collegiate Success," an article from Morris's Truckers & Turnover Project (T&T), has been released online by the Journal of Economic Behavior and Organization. The paper analyzes the individual characteristics that predict the later graduation success in a sample of 100 Morris students on whom data was initially collected in 2007 (originally as a control group for a study of trainee truckers). Co-authors of the paper are **Stephen Burks**, professor of economics and management, **Connor Lewis '15**, Paul Kivi, Bemidji State University, **Amanda Wiener '14**, **Jon Anderson**, professor of statistics, Lorenz Goette, University of Lausanne, Colin DeYoung, UM-TC, and Aldo Rustichini, UM-TC.
