- D. New Business:
  - a. Representatives (Kimberly Novotny, Mariah Turner and Cole Maxwell) from MCSA's First Year Council presented on food insecurity on campus and current groups/offices working on this issue and resources available to students. The council recommends that there be a more cohesive effort between groups and that more communication is needed, especially to new students. Possible ideas for freshman orientation, MYU News features, resources listed in class syllabi, and/or webpage on the Morris Healthy Eating website or MCSA website.
  - b. Poster Policy Practices - Procedure draft is being worked on and will be shared with committee members to review and edit.
  - c. Subcommittee (Bryan Nell, Emily Johnson, and Cole Maxwell) was created to review nominations for Allen W. Edson Award and present to larger committee for approval.
  - d. The following organization was submitted for approval by this committee. Cole Maxwell made a motion to approve. Emily Johnson seconded the motion and all members approved.

Purpose: The *College Conservatives* has been established to promote, support, and participate in conservative ideologies and activities on the UMM campus and in the broader community. In order to best serve the

student body and those interested in conservative activities, the purpose of the *College Conservatives at UMM* is to perform the following:

- a. Initiate and encourage social and service oriented activities which may or may not be of a political nature.
- b. Offer an open environment for individual views to be discussed, supported, and/or acted upon.
- c. Initiate and encourage political events and learning opportunities for all students, faculty, staff, and the broader community that reflect positively on *College Conservatives* and the University of Minnesota and Morris campus.
- d. Promote conservative ideology among students, faculty, staff, and the community.
- e. The club will not support the nomination, campaign, and election of conservative and/or Republican candidates in local, state, and federal elections. However, individuals in the club may without the clubs interference support the nomination, campaign, and election of conservative and/or Republican candidates in local, state, and federal elections
