Burks Presents at 10th International Conference on Managing Fatigue

Professor of Economics and Management **Stephen Burks** presented an invited talk at the <u>10th</u> <u>International Conference on Managing Fatigue</u> in San Diego, California, on Monday, March 20. The talk

was titled "Non-Adherence with Employer-Mandated Sleep Apnea Treatment and Increased Risk of Serious Truck Crashes" and presented the <u>paper of the same name</u> published in 2016 in the medical journal *Sleep* based on <u>the work of Morris's Truckers & Turnover Project and its co-authors at other institutions</u>.
