- 2. Tech Fee Guidelines Update presented by Secretary Westfield

We are changing the Tech Fee guidelines to make it easier for everyone involved. The main change will be that MCSA is getting \$50,000 to allocate which is less than previous years. The rest of the money will be going to IT to make campus technology better including classroom revamping, wifi fixes, and wifi on the mall. We still get final decision if we want to give the money to IT because they are on an 8 year cycle. Proposed changes/additions are linked in the minutes.

Technology will now be renewed every 8 years for different departments which makes the process smoother and allows for us to have the most updated technology. We still have the option to say no to proposals but IT will come to discuss technology changes for campus as a whole this year which will decrease the time spent arguing about allocations. IT has a whole plan for the next 8 years but will be coming next week to propose making this decision and hear our feedback. Tech Fee is scheduled for a Saturday this year at the end of March and we have left Sunday open for hearings if need be. We will stay after forum that following Monday and allocate money. We'll still have to vote to approve these

updates to the Tech Fee guidelines. Tech Fee and the time for allocations are mandatory for people who hold positions. It will be on March 30th - April 1st and expect to spend your whole day there. It will be in Science 1020 and there will be food/time for fun. It's not guaranteed that time will be cut this year but it is expected.

3. Facebook Forum Guidelines Review presented by Secretary Gillette
These are just proposed changes with suggestions. This will change who is
allowed to post to the FaceBook Forum. There are changes to the moderation of
the Forum so moderators can remove posts and turn off commenting for posts.
There's also changes to make the Guidelines do smoother. Changes were made to
lost and found posts which will make it so no pictures can be posted with found
items. Posts shared by students which were made by businesses can be shared to
Forum if they are deemed relevant to UMM students. They added the word
"negatively" when discussing targeted posts and moderators will have the last
word about what negatively will mean.
