Campus Assembly Minutes
February 25, 1980

Provost Imholte opened the Assembly with the following announcements:

1. The search for a Chairperson of the Education Division should be concluded within the week.
2. Budgetary recommendations for UMM have been received from the central administration. They are for 1980-81 and 1981-82. Neither retrenchment nor incremental resources for positions are recommended. The purchase of a micro-computer for the Business Office was recommended for the purpose of aiding UMM in planning for the future. That recommendation may be removed from the report or reworded.
3. The capital improvement request is receiving hearings at the State Legislature. It includes work for the Computer Center and a new greenhouse. Odds are even-up for success.
4. The Board of Teaching visit will begin on March 10 and go through March 12.
5. Encouragement was given to attend events of Black History Week and the UMM theatre production.
6. Enrollment remains ahead by about 5 to 10% of last year.

Steve Granger presented for information a document from the Student Behavior Committee entitled "Student Disciplinary Action." This document incorporates the Regents' Conduct Code. The code applies to both individuals and to student organizations. A broader range of sanctions exists as a result of this wider breadth of application. Also an appeals process is included. Ted Uehling offered an editorial change on page five to delete reference to the Honors Case Commission. Also, Truman Driggs requested clarification of the paragraph on page 8 under Appeals Procedures. The word "against" should be replaced with "by" in the first sentence. Despite this change, questions were raised about the role of the Academic Integrity Committee in relation to the document and to the Student Behavior Committee. Because the processes have yet to be tried, it was claimed difficult to respond fully to such inquiries.

Also for information, the statement, "Modification of the Academic Progress Requirements to Cover Not Only Full-time but Certain Part-time Students As Well" was placed before the Assembly from the Scholastic Committee. No discussion followed its introduction to the Assembly.

An action item from the Curriculum Committee was offered by Dean Blake. These were curricular proposals in math and computer science explained by Jim Olson, Chair of the Science and Math Division. The course proposals carried by voice vote.

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The minutes of the October 15, 1979, Assembly meeting, as amended, were accepted by voice vote.

Another item from the Curriculum Committee was placed before the Assembly for action. The approval of Education 3011, Self Concept and Student Behavior was by voice vote. No discussion of the proposal occurred.

Finally, an action item from the Functions and Awards Committee was passed designating Michael Plytas as graduating from UMM "With Distinction" at the end of summer session II, 1979.

With that congratulatory gesture, the Assembly adjourned at 5 p.m.
