- G. [Resolution Concerning Campus Assembly Committee Consolidation](#) Update

Switching track, we are thinking of writing a letter to show support for the Committee Consolidation to be delivered to campus and Steering Committee.

What do you guys think?

Nelson- *did not raise her hand and has gotten in trouble* I agree, how necessary is a resolution if it needs to be voted on anyway?

Brown- I disagree, I vote no

Brichacek- The process will be Campus Assembly will vote on whether or not we want to vote. The biggest struggle is getting that vote to take place. A letter for support to be read is beneficial because it has a bigger impact as a resolution. A letter of support feels like it would be more successful to at least bring things to a vote.

Bauer- Are a lot of people against the consolidation?

Brichacek- Not everyone, people are for about 4 of the 6 but its a different 4 for everyone. People are for throwing work to other people so hopefully we can pass 3 of them. The other option is taking them one by one to Campus Assembly but it will take a full year for that but hopefully this will be more efficient.

Brown- I fully disagree, Consultative Committee is fully behind this consolidation.

Nelson- Consultative Committee is behind getting rid of themselves?

Brown- A few people disagreed, most everyone agrees. People can be consulted in different capacities. We should do a resolution because it is much more direct and efficient. No resolution would make it easier for Steering to do their thing but a resolution looks really good for MCSA to other faculty and staff and hearing from students can change their minds and we can make more sense to them to make greater impacts to the Campus Assembly body.

Scovil- I agree, Consultative thinks they are not doing enough. Whether or not people are picking and choosing committees, it would be more efficient by consolidating but people don't want to see change.

Nelson- I think we will get to the vote and then 6 options will be the problem.

Brichacek- We should focus on getting the vote so we can get something going.

Nelson- And the majority will agree that 3 or 4 should go with a resolution or statement.

Johnson- Can we write a resolution in the form of a letter?

Brichacek- A resolution will carry weight but a letter will show the emotion.

Brown- Campus Assembly can not adopt a letter but they can adopt a resolution

Brichacek- We are not looking to adopt, that is something we can do later.

Brown- We might want to adopt this someday.

Scovil and Brown agree with Johnson

Brichacek- Will steering want to put this on the agenda?

Brown- Steering will not want to put this on the agenda.

Brichacek- A letter will be listened to more.

Brown and Brichacek- This needs to be approved by steering because introducing it out of order in Campus Assembly will mess things up.

Nelson- Staff on multiple committees for decades are tired and we should strong arm them into seeing we need to structure our committees.

Brichacek- More of something to do with the facts behind it. There are important pieces and it is important we show the passion. It is not in the resolution format which is good but in this case we want to rally people instead of just saying it is

important. A polling place is important and we want it but this is different because we want it to be an issue they work on with us.

Rosemark- Before today and a couple days ago I was thinking about writing a bunch of “whereas” and “resolve” but the letter would be the proper tool and messaging tone around it to convey what we want. A resolution is bare bones so a letter now and if they don’t listen or do anything, do a resolution. Doing a second resolution if they do nothing would not be the same.

Brown- That’s good but a strongly worded letter is a good idea if it comes from a strong place of passion. The next administration should write a resolution on not getting rid of finance and planning, and instead consolidating the two. Students need representation, if there is no consultative, it gives up a student representative attached to the 3 in consultative committee so ask for 3 in steering. In addition to the president and vice president in steering.

Brichacek- Bringing up amendments as they are and not making changes because we should not be bringing a revised version of a vision to Campus Assembly. A statement would get things going now and a resolution in the future. Part of things now and further revisions later.

Nelson- Articulate that if you don’t like how it is written, do not vote to change it.

Brichacek- A vote to have a change then decide on what specific changes need to be made.

Nelson- Right now, if we decide right now we want to make amendments, then someone has to decide and we need to agree on it.

Brichacek- Let’s focus on a vote now then focus on changes happening next year. We want to see actual amendments. We need to make a stronger case in Campus Assembly pending additional changes to this.

Brown- I agree, we can’t ignore certain sections. Also, think about creating our own constitution and amendment task force because we will need to change ours and have 25% of the student body vote on it. A month and a half in advance of the end of the year to get to working on it so we can stay ahead.

Brichacek- We can evaluate depending on what will happen on this vote.

Brown- voting to vote

Brichacek- Then 2 weeks for electronic voting

Brown- It's way late in the school year so it's good we're thinking about it now

Brichacek- The next administration can think about it deeper

Johnson motions to write a letter now and a resolutions later is necessary

Brown seconds
