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African and Black American Studies (ABAS)
Program Student Learning Outcomes

1. Students will be able to identify examples of material, metaphysical, and intellectual life and livelihoods across the United States, Africa, and the African Diaspora.
 2. Students will be able to describe distinct consequences of colonialism and racism in the past and present lives of people, regardless of racial, ethnic, and national background.
 3. Students will be able to apply scholarly theories of black subjectivity to explain everyday and extraordinary world affairs.
 4. Students will be able to produce at least one substantial, research- and theory-driven, creative or scholarly work that incorporates at least two separate knowledge domains.
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1. The ABAS committee will periodically review ABAS faculty's syllabi and ABAS student transcripts to assess ABAS PSLO 1.
 2. Members of the ABAS committee will periodically review ABAS students' classwork, particularly formal and informal written work and oral presentations, to assess ABAS PSLO 2.
 3. To assess PSLO 3, members of the ABAS committee will periodically review at least two collections of faculty- and student-generated material from a given ABAS course of the ABAS students' choosing.
 4. To assess PSLO 4, the ABAS student will give a senior seminar and members of the ABAS committee will evaluate.
