STUDENTS HAVE BEEN REQUESTING THE INFORMATION REGARDING CAREER SKILLS ON AN INFORMAL BASIS, AND THIS WILL BE AN APPROPRIATE MEANS TO STREAMLINE THE INFORMATION AND PREPARE THEM FOR FUTURE POST-GRADUATE OPPORTUNITIES IN THE ARTS. FACULTY ALSO SEEK A COMPONENT TO THE STUDIO ART MAJOR IN LINE WITH OTHER COPLAC ART PROGRAMS AND THAT REFLECT THE QUALITY OF THE STUDIO ART PROGRAM WITHIN THE OVERALL MISSION OF UMM.
