Cougar women's basketball among the nation's best

Summary: Brandi Cresap's assist turnover ratio is the best in NCAA basketball, men or women, regardless of division.

(February 10, 2011)-The Cougar women's basketball team continues to lead the NCAA in assists, averaging 19.6 per game. Setting the pace is floor leader Brandi Cresap, Perham, who continues to lead the nation in assist turnover ratio, and has now doubled-up her closest competitor with her mark of 6.50 after the Cougars latest set of games.

In fact, Cresap's mark is the best in NCAA basketball, men or women, and regardless of division.

As a team, the Cougars rank fifth in the nation in assist turnover ratio at 1.18 per game.

Their third top-five ranking as a team comes in field goal percentage, where the 46.6 mark is fourth nationally, and just two percentage points behind the national leader.

Tara Thielke, Hancock, ranks No. 23 in the country in three-point field goal percentage, hitting from long range at a 43 percent clip, and Steph Roggenbuck, Osakis, is No. 27 in field goal percentage at 53.9 percent.
