## Eight honored by Academy awards

Eight special recognition awards and citations were announced at the 45th annual meeting of the Minnesota Academy of Science at St. Cloud, Minnesota, April 29-30.

Four of the citations were designated for specific accomplishments of distinction and were presented to:

John B. Moyle, who has retired from the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources (formerly called the Conservation Department) after a career of research, writing and teaching; and who has been a long-time Academy member and officer.

L. D. Frenzel, University of Minnesota faculty member who was cited for his scientific work and service to the Academy in several capacities, including terms as president.

Max Partch, St. Cloud State University.

Marie Berg, Metropolitan Community College Science educator.

Other awards presented at the 1977 meeting went to:

Herschel Siebrass, for service to the Academy through the Junior Academy of Science program.

Robert Herbst, Commissioner of the Minnesota Department of Natural Resources who recently assumed the second-highest position in the Federal Department of Interior.

Richard Gray, who led in development of the Freshwater Research Laboratory at Lake Minnetonka.

Vice President Walter Mondale also was named to receive a special citation in appreciation for his support of Academy programs when he was a Minnesota senator.

## Science and Engineering award winners named

Charles Clelvenger of Excelsior, Minnesota, has been designated to receive a scholarship award following his participation as a representative from Minnesota in the International Science and Engineering Fair for high school and junior high students.
