Maas Family Endowed Chair in Bioethics to speak tonight at First-Year Seminar Convocation

Summary: Jeffrey Kahn, PhD, MPH, will speak on “Individual Interests and Societal Concerns—The Ethics of Creating a Stem Cell Donor.”

(September 2, 2009)-Jeffrey Kahn, PhD, MPH, will serve as the University of Minnesota, Morris’s First Year Seminar (FYS) Convocation speaker tonight, Wednesday, September 2, 2009, at 7 p.m., in Edson Auditorium in the Student Center. Kahn serves as director, professor, and Maas Family Endowed Chair in Bioethics at the Center for Bioethics on the Twin Cities campus, as well as professor at the Department of Medicine at the University of Minnesota Medical School.
