Summary: Dr. Jerome McGann, John Stewart Bryan University Professor, University of Virginia, will deliver the 2006 Barber Lecture, "Philology in a New Key: Humane Studies in Digital Space," at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 12, in 109 Imholte Hall (formerly the Social Science building) at UMM.

(September 26, 2006)-Dr. Jerome McGann, John Stewart Bryan University Professor, University of Virginia, will deliver the 2006 Barber Lecture, "Philology in a New Key: Humane Studies in Digital Space," at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Oct. 12, in 109 Imholte Hall (formerly the Social Science building) at the University of Minnesota, Morris. The public is invited to attend the free lecture and the reception that follows.

McGann is internationally celebrated for his scholarship on Wordsworth, Byron, Rossetti and Swinburne, as well as for his theoretical contributions to the study of textual editing, romanticism, modernism and literary history. He has emerged as a pioneer in using new technologies to develop groundbreaking models of textual scholarship and critical practice. McGann is the author or editor of over 20 books, including edited writings of 19th century poets, original scholarship and poetry of his own. He is the John Stewart Bryan Professor of 19th and 20th century History and Theory of Texts and a cofounder of the Institute for Advanced Technology in the Humanities.

The annual Barber Lecture is made possible through philanthropic gifts from the late Dorothy Barber and Laird Barber, professor emeritus of English.
