13th Annual Northern Plains Conference on Earlier British Literature

Summary:

(April 12, 2005)-The 13th Annual Northern Plains Conference on Earlier British Literature will be held April 15-16 at the

University of Minnesota, Morris. The Conference is hosted this year by the UMM English discipline.

In keeping with its tradition of encouraging dialogue across historical periods and keeping teachers of British literature informed about and engaged with scholarship and criticism over a broad range of their teaching responsibilities, the NPCEBL will offer a program of papers on the literature of the British Isles from 500 to about 1688.

Keynote speaker Paul Yachnin, McGill University, Tomlinson Professor of Shakespeare Studies, will speak on “Populuxe Art and Artisanal Value in Shakespeare’s *Troilus and Cressida*.” His presentation, open to the public, will be held from 5:30-6:30 p.m. Friday, April 15 in Science room 3610.
