31st Annual Creative Study Institute

Summary:

(April 28, 2004)-The University of Minnesota Morris will host students in grades 6 to 12 during the Henjum Creative Study Institute June 7-18. The institute, sponsored by the College of Continuing Education with support from area schools, will offer classes in raku pottery, radio broadcasting, printmaking, dance and movement, jazz ensemble, vocal music, acting and directing, improvisation, digital storytelling (desktop video production), introduction to computer art, and alternative photography I and II.

The Institute sets up a healthy environment for learning and fun. One student commented, "it is the highlight of my summer each year." Those involved consistently comment on how many students discover the joy of learning when they get to study something in depth in the summer without academic requirements and grades.

The Institute, now in its 31st year, has served more than 4,000 are students over the past 30 summers. Students choose two subjects of special interest to them, and learn from excellent teachers on the nationally recognized UMM campus. Students find many opportunities to meet other students with shared interests.

Registrations will be accepted through June 1. A \$15 discount will be given to students who enroll by May 7, have been to the Institute before, and/or bring a friend who has never been to the Institute. Tuition is \$225, with an additional \$5 fee for technology courses and \$15 for printmaking, raku, and photography I and II.

Some schools help with tuition and provide transportation to the event. For an additional fee of \$65, a bus can pick up students and drop them off at Alexandria, Glenwood, Starbuck, and Cyrus. Scholarships based on financial need are also available.
