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Master of Education Information Session set for March 29 at UMM

Summary:

(March 11, 2004)-A Master of Education (M.Ed.) and graduate credit information session will be held from 5 - 7 p.m. Monday, March 29, in Oyate Hall of the Student Center on the University of Minnesota, Morris campus. Anyone with a bachelor's degree and an interest in pursuing an advanced degree is welcome to attend.

Representatives from the University of Minnesota - Duluth's (UMD) College of Education and Human Service Professions (CEHSP) will be on hand to present an overview of the M.Ed program and graduate courses that will be available on the Morris campus as early as fall 2004. Education faculty from UMD and UMM will be available to discuss the professional education needs of area educators and others during the session.

The master's program is delivered in a cohort, with 20-25 professionals moving through common or core courses as a group in a blended course format. Online instruction will replace some of the traditional face-to-face meetings and classes in the M.Ed. program, allowing students from rural Minnesota and surrounding states to continue full time employment while completing the degree. There will be a demonstration of the technology used in the online components of the program at the March 29 session at UMM.
