George Winston is next Performing Arts artist

Summary:

(October 1, 2003)-Grammy-award winning pianist and composer, George Winston, will perform in Edson Auditorium at 7:30 p.m., Friday, Oct. 17, as a part of the 2003-04 Performing Arts Series at the University of Minnesota, Morris.

Winston is described by Dirty Linen magazine as “the undisputed master of contemporary solo piano.” His unique sound derives from the blending of jazz, rhythm and blues, folk, stride, and classical music. Winston is considered by many to be one of the best known and most loved pianists of our time.
