Summary:

(September 16, 2003)-NBC News senior correspondent Fred Francis will open the 2003-04 CAC Convocations Lecture Series at the University of Minnesota, Morris, in Edson Auditorium 7:30 p.m., Monday, Sept. 29. This event is free and open to the public.

Francis, best known for his news coverage of major crises and conflicts involving U.S. policy and American Troops, will present “Did the U.S. win the war in Iraq and is the U.S. winning peace in the Middle East?” Most recently, Francis reported in Iraq before and during the war.

Over a distinguished career of 37 years, Francis has twice won a national news Emmy for his reporting and has received the coveted Columbia-Dupont award.

The mission of CAC Convocations is to challenge conventional thought and promote a diverse community by presenting a year-long series of various speakers and events. The next Convocations speaker will be FBI staff attorney Coleen Rowley on October 27.
