Homecoming weekend gets underway at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday, Sept. 24, at with a Recognition and Pep Fest in Edson Auditorium during which members of UMM student organizations will be recognized as the homecoming court and athletic teams will be introduced.

Alumni events begin at 5:30 p.m. Friday, Sept. 26, with an Awards Dinner and the Alumni Association annual meeting in Turtle Mountain Cafe in the Student Center. John Dayton '68 will receive the 2003 Distinguished Alumni Award, given to honor UMM alumni have made noteworthy contributions in their professional lives, to public service, or in service to the University, thus reflecting favorably upon UMM. Dayton, of Dallas, Texas, is described by UMM alumni director Pat Gannon '70 as "an outstanding alumnus." The Homecoming Parade, a UMM tradition, begins at 11:30 a.m. Saturday, Sept. 27. Basil Meyer '87, 2003 NSIC Hall of Fame Inductee, will serve as the Parade's grand marshal. Meyer was an All-American tight end in football and also pitched in Minnesota Twins minor leagues for four years.

The UMM football Cougars will take the field versus Carthage College at 1 p.m. Meyer will be honored with a special half-time presentation.
