Concert Band and Concert Choir to perform traditional Homecoming Concert

Summary:

(September 9, 2003)-The Concert Band and Concert Choir at the University of Minnesota, Morris, will perform a Homecoming Concert at 2 p.m., Sunday, Sept. 28, in Recital Hall of Humanities Fine Arts. This musical performance, which has long been a capstone to UMM Homecoming week, is free and open to the public.

Dr. John Stanley Ross, UMM director of bands and professor of conducting, clarinet, and saxophone, will conduct the Concert Band in "Festive Overture" by Dmitri Shostakovich/Donald Humsberger, "Amazing Grace" by Frank Ticheli and "Children's March" by Percy Aldridge Grainger.

Dr. Kenneth Hodgson, UMM choral director, will lead the Concert Choir in "O Seigneur, loue seraï" by Jan Sweelinck Bach's "Death I do not fear thee" "Sleep" by Eric Whitacre "O Waly, Waly," an English Folk Song "Ezekiel Saw The Wheel," a Spiritual "Oh Dear! What can the Matter Be," an American folk song arranged by Gail Kubik and "Shalom Chaverim," a Hebrew Folk Song arranged by Hodgson.

The Concert Band and Concert Choir will collaborate on "Ave Verum Corpus" by Mozart.
