Michael Moshen afternoon workshop for kids of all ages

Summary:

(September 3, 2003)-Students of all ages who are interested in math, physics and the arts will especially enjoy a workshop to be given by visionary performing artist Michael Moshen at 1 p.m. Friday, Sept. 19, in Edson Auditorium on the campus of the University of Minnesota, Morris. The presentation, aptly titled “Math, Physics and the Arts,” is free and open to the public.

Ranked as one of the world’s leading jugglers and described by New York magazine as “poetry in Moschen,” Moschen will also give an evening performance at 7:30 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 20, to open this year’s Performing Arts Season at UMM. Moshen’s artistry is sure to captivate the entire family.
