**"Mystery of Edwin Drood" will open UMM theater season group rates offered**

*Summary:*

(July 22, 2003)-Does your spine tingle at a good mystery? Does your heart sing during a musical comedy? For the best of both worlds, how about a spine-tingling, heart-singing, "solve-it-yourself" murder mystery music hall comedy that's fun for the whole family?!

"The Mystery of Edwin Drood," a musical adaptation by Rupert Holmes of Charles Dickens' final novel, will open the 2003-2004 play performance season at the University of Minnesota, Morris. Audiences will experience a superior blend of music and drama in this unique collaboration between the UMM theater and music disciplines. The play is directed by Ray Schultz, with set and lighting design by Tap R. Payne, both of the UMM theater faculty. Musical direction will be offered by Hope Koehler of the UMM music discipline. The orchestra will be conducted by UMM music faculty member, Clifford Panton, Jr.

Performances are set for Wednesday through Saturday, Nov. 5-8, in the Proscenium Theatre of Humanities Fine Arts on the Morris campus. Performances will begin at 7:30 p.m. Wednesday through Friday, and at 2 p.m. and 7:30 p.m. on Saturday.

"The Mystery of Edwin Drood," originally produced by Joe Papp's New York Public Theatre in Central Park in the summer of 1985, starred Betty Buckley, George Rose, and legendary jazz great Cleo Laine. A critical and popular hit, it subsequently transferred to Broadway and went on to win five Tony Awards, including Best Musical and Best Score. It has since been produced by professional and amateur companies all over the country and around the world.

The appeal of "Drood" rests in its interactive nature. The events of Dickens' novel are placed in the context of a British Music Hall, complete with wonderfully rousing song and dance numbers and classic comedy routines. What's more, highlighting the "unfinished" nature of Dickens' final work, the audience is invited to participate in the outcome of the musical's plot. At each performance the audience is invited to vote on several key plot elements, including the identity of Edwin Drood's killer. Depending on how the audience votes, over a dozen different outcomes are possible, which promises an evening in the theater filled with fun, mystery, and unexpected surprises. Repeat customers to "Drood" experience a unique treat: virtually a new outcome each night!
