Go to the head of the class if you guessed the Henjum Creative Study Institute at the University of Minnesota, Morris.

Nearly 70 students in grades 6-12 are participating in the 30th Annual Institute on the campus through June 20. The two-week summer enrichment program offers courses in raku pottery, jazz ensemble, vocal music, theater arts, creative writing, web design, alternative photography, printmaking, radio broadcasting, and two new courses in mask performance and computer art.

Student achievements will be showcased in a public program of performances and displays on Friday, June 20. Completed projects in raku, creative writing, photography, printmaking, web pages and radio broadcasting will be on display in the east lobby of the Humanities Fine Arts building from 9 a.m. to noon. Performances by theater, vocal music, computer animation and jazz ensembles classes will be given from 10:30 to 11:45 a.m. in HFA Recital Hall.

Admission is free and the public is invited to attend.
