**Women's soccer team wins UMAC, again**

*Summary: For the second consecutive season, the UMM women's soccer team entered the Upper Midwest Athletic Conference UMAC post-season tournament as the number two seed. For the second straight season, the Cougars brought the tournament championship home.*

(November 7, 2005)-For the second consecutive season, the University of Minnesota-Morris women's soccer team entered the Upper Midwest Athletic Conference (UMAC) post-season tournament as the number two seed. For the second straight season, the Cougars are bringing home the tournament championship.

Saturday, UMM recorded their second consecutive 2-0 win, this time over Martin Luther College. The win followed a 2-0 shutout Friday over Northland College in the semi final round.

Amber Dziengel (So. Villard, MN) gave Minnesota-Morris the only goal they would need at the 41:59 mark of the first half for a 1-0 Cougar lead. Jaima Solie (So. Mahtomedi, MN) and Steph Clark (So. Colorado Springs, CO) picked up the assists on the goal.

Steph Clark, who had a big weekend offensively for the Cougars, added an unassisted goal at 89:29 to make the final 2-0. Clark had a pair of assists in Friday's win of Northland and added the assist and goal in Saturday's title game to give her five points for the weekend.

Amanda Prodger (Sr. Wyoming, MN) recorded her second straight shut out and fourth overall with help from the defense as the Knights were held to just one shot on goal. The Cougars had 16 shots, eight on goal in the game.

The Cougars, who won the post-season championship last year, and won the regular season title in 2003 finish the year at 10-9-2, the fourth straight winning season for the women's soccer team.

In the three years as a member of the UMAC conference, Minnesota-Morris is 24-2 in regular season conference games and a perfect 4-0 in post-season tournament play.
