Nader will discuss the role of citizen leadership in overcoming sustainability-related challenges. His talk and book signing are free and open to the public.

Honored by *Time* magazine as “One of the 100 Most Influential Americans of the 20th Century,” Nader continues to fight the good fight in government and in public opinion. He helped create the Occupational Safety and Health Administration, the Environmental Protection Agency, and the Consumer Product Safety Commission. Due to his zeal, we now have safer drinking water, cleaner air, and freedom of information. His citizen groups such as the Public Interest Research Groups flourish on the Morris campus and the national stage, striving to protect the public and advance social justice.
