Office of Community Engagement Hosts Annual Trick or Can

MORRIS, Minnesota (October 22, 2015)—The University of Minnesota, Morris will once again host its annual Trick or Can event on Saturday, October 31st, from 6–8 p.m. Students will be knocking on doors across Morris and collecting donations for the Stevens County Food Shelf.

Community members who wish to participate may do so by having a donation ready for volunteers who come to their doors. The Stevens County Food Shelf accepts nonperishable items and unopened personal hygiene items, as well as monetary donations in the form of cash or checks made out to the Stevens County Food Shelf. The food shelf is in particular need of healthy soups, cereals, pastas, and juices in addition to paper goods like paper towels, tissues, and toilet paper.

Last year UMM students gathered 887 pounds of food and more than \$700 in donations. They hope to gather \$750 and 950 pounds of food in 2015.
