UNIVERSITY OF MINNESOTA, MORRIS

The opening day of classes at the University of Minnesota, Morris, will be September 26, 1960, has been announced by Acting Dean Rodney A. Briggs.

Registration and orientation activities will be in advance of this date, but actual classes will start September 26.

Information on entrance requirements has been mailed to high schools in West Central Minnesota. Registration is expected to start as soon as the curriculum and costs have been determined.

Chemistry, English, Biology and History are a few of the offerings in the proposed course offerings for the start of the collegiate program at Morris in the fall of 1960.

The curriculum is now under study by the University of Minnesota's Morris Campus Advisory Committee. A program of necessary course offerings for the first year's program is being studied. Emphasis is being placed upon developing a curricula that will meet the needs of the incoming college freshmen in Western Minnesota. Courses will be offered that will fulfill requirements of most professional schools anywhere in the United States.

First year offerings under study will provide the first year program for Science, Literature and Arts and many professional areas.

Credits earned will be transferable to the Minneapolis or St. Paul campuses of the University of Minnesota as well as to most colleges in the United States.

Final curriculum plans will be announced as soon as they are available.
