#### DAIRY CONFERENCE ON UMM CAMPUS APRIL 29-30

The Annual Research Dairy Conference is being held on the University of Minnesota, Morris, Campus April 29 and 30 announces Prof. Harley Hanke, Animal Husbandman at the West Central School and Station at Morris.

The program will get under-way at 8:30 Friday morning with a welcome by Acting Dean Rodney Briggs, followed by Associate Dean T. H. Fenske of the Institute of Agriculture. At 9 o'clock the Branch Station reports will be given by Ralph Grant, Superintendent of the Northeast Experiment Station at Duluth, Richard Anderson, Instructor at the North Central School and Experiment Station at Grand Rapids, Kenneth Miller, Assistant Professor at the Southern School and Station at Waseca, Edward Frederick, Assistant Professor at the Northwest School and Station at Crookston, and Harley Hanke.

Following the reports the group will tour the Morris Station to look over the dairy herd and the dairy projects carried on at this Station.

The Friday morning session will be presided over by C. L. Cole, Head of the Dairy Department of the University of Minnesota. Robert Hodgson, Superintendent of the Southern School and Station at Waseca, will preside over the afternoon and evening meeting with Ned Bagley of the USDA Dairy Department at Beltsville, Maryland, discussing the Federal dairy project. Dr. C. L. Cole will discuss the project as it applies to Minnesota.

Walter Hokanson, dairy herdsman at the Morris Station, and herdsmen from the other stations will hold a round table discussion with Prof. W. E. Petersen and Prof. Jesse Williams of the Institute of Agriculture on "Management Problems".

At the evening meeting "Reciprocal Cooperation" will be discussed by Dr. Milton F. Kernkamp, Assistant Director of the Experiment Station of the Institute of Agriculture.

Saturday's program with Superintendent B. E. Youngquist of Crookston presiding will include a "Review of Physiological Problems" by Prof. Edmund F. Graham of the Institute of Agriculture, "Nutritional Research" by Prof. John Donker and "Results of Calf Research and Future Proposals" by Prof. Williams. These men are all from the Institute of Agriculture.
