#### FIRST UMM ENROLLEE RECEIVES FIRST UMM SCHOLARSHIP

Mary Louise Vogel, Henning, Minnesota, who had the honor of being the first student to enroll at the University of Minnesota, Morris, last winter, has received another first. She has been selected to receive the first scholarship from the General Scholarship fund at the University of Minnesota, Morris. Miss Vogel will receive \$125 to apply on the fall quarter tuition and fees. Mary is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. James Vogel of Henning. She has four sisters.

Miss Vogel was valedictorian of her class at Henning High School. She was Homecoming Queen last fall and during her high school career she was in band, school newspaper work, girls athletic association, pep club and drama club. She was president of the chorus council and captained the cheerleading squad. She was a cheerleader for five years. Her plans are to enter the teaching field.

Dean Briggs also announced that three other scholarships have been awarded from the same general fund. They were made to Barry King of Morris, Patricia Hopkins of Villard, and LaDell Grote of rural Morris.
