MORRIS AGGIES TAKE GRAND RAPIDS 18-0

After a scoreless first half the Morris Aggies broke loose for three touchdowns in the second half to down the Aggies of Grand Rapids 18-0. Grand Rapids threw a stubborn defense at the Morris team and the first half was played in midfield for the most. In the second half the Morris boys improved their blocking and scored two touchdowns in the third quarter and one in the fourth. Grand Rapids seriously threatened to score only once but fumbled inside the 5-yard line. Next week the Aggies journey to Crookston for their annual battle with the Crookston Agricultural School.

The West Central Aggie Harriers successfully defended their conference championship on Wednesday of last week when they defeated Crookston 23-37 on the local course.
