#### SECOND YEAR COURSES ANNOUNCED AT UMM

Approval of second year course offerings at the University of Minnesota, Morris has been secured from the Morris Campus Advisory Committee, it was announced recently by Dean Rodney A. Briggs.

In the fall of 1961 the University of Minnesota, Morris will offer a complete lower division (freshman-sophomore) liberal arts program and will also have strong academic pre-professional curriculum in many subject matter areas.

The offerings are designed to meet the needs of the 1961 incoming freshman class and those of the 1960 freshman who will enter their sophomore year in 1961.

Students who will eventually major in an academic subject matter area may select from a range of courses in each of the following areas: art, English, composition and literature, speech, humanities, foreign languages, music, philosophy, economics and business, geography, history, political science, psychology, sociology, biology, chemistry, geology, physics and mathematics.

For students in a pre-professional sequence the freshman-sophomore program will provide the following: two years of pre-law, pre-journalism, pre-business administration, pre-medicine, pre-dentistry, pre-pharmacy, pre-nursing, pre-engineering, pre-forestry, pre-art education, pre-music education, pre-physical education, and one year in all pre-agricultural specialties and two years in many specialties.

Also offered will be one year of pre-physical therapy, pre-medical technology, home economics, elementary education, and recreational leadership.

The bulletin of the 1961-62 program with full descriptions of all courses will be available in early March.

The aim of the Morris Campus Advisory Committee has been to maintain the high standards of the University of Minnesota and meet the needs of college students in West Central Minnesota. A small student body, a strong counseling program and student-teacher relationships important for the educational development of many students is a distinguishing characteristic of the University of Minnesota, Morris.
