## UMM TO PRESENT FILM SERIES

Beginning with "The Lavender Hill Mob" on February 27 the University of Minnesota, Morris Film Series will present to subscribers a wide variety of films from many countries and times. The series of eight films, to be shown on Monday evenings, is open to both students and the public by subscription to the entire group. *of films*

Following the British comedy which stars Alec Guinness on February 27, an Italian neo-realist film, "Umberto D", with Vittorio de Sica, <sup>Sica</sup> is scheduled for March 6. "All the King's Men", an American film supposedly based on the life of Louisiana's Huey Long, will be shown on March 27.

The award-winning Japanese picture, "Rashomon", is scheduled for April 10, while a French tragedy, "Symphonie Pastorale", will be presented on April 17. The latter is an adaptation of Andre Gide's Nobel Prize-winning novel. "Odd Man Out", a British mystery directed by Carol Reed, will be shown April 24.

May films will be Arthur Miller's famous tragedy, "Death of a Salesman", starring Frederick March on May 8, and the most famous classic film of all time, "Potemkin" by Eisenstein. This Russian silent picture will be seen May 22. Confirmation has been received for exhibition of all of the films
