UMM MUSIC GROUPS TO PERFORM IN ARTIST SERIES

A new march, "Cougar Conquest", and the first public appearance of the University of Minnesota, Morris symphony orchestra will be among the noteworthy features of the final University Artist Course program at 8:30 p.m. tonight in Edson Hall auditorium.

Since the cougar is the official UMM mascot, Ralph E. Williams, assistant professor of music at UMM, has written words for the trio of "Cougar Conquest" which will be sung by band members. The march was composed by Paul Yoder, one of the best-known band arrangers in America and a friend of Professor Williams.

Performing at tonight's concert for subscribers of the Artist Series will be all of the UMM music groups. Opening the program will be the 44-piece orchestra in its public debut, followed by a group of selections by the string ensemble.

The men's chorus and the mixed chorus will each sing several numbers and the program will conclude with selections by the UMM band.

This evening's concert will be repeated next Tuesday, May 16, for the general public. Tickets for the second concert may be purchased from band members or the UMM business office at 75 cents for adults and 50 cents for students.
