MORRIS FIELD DAY - JULY 13, 1961

The Annual Summer Field Day of the University of Minnesota, West Central School and Experiment Station, Morris, Minnesota, will be held Thursday, July 13, 1961. The program will start with tours of the experimental areas at 9:30 in the morning. The visitors will be given an opportunity to see experimental plots of corn, soybeans, small grains, and flax.

A Plant Problem Clinic will be held in conjunction with the field day. Specialists will be available to identify insects, diseases, and weeds and to offer recommendations concerning the control of these problems. Visitors are asked to bring along specimens of the particular problem that they may have.

Equipment will be set up to demonstrate the tractor wheel-track planting of corn and specialists will be available to discuss some of the benefits as well as problems that are encountered in this system of corn culture.

A program is being planned for the ladies, starting at 10 a.m. Rachel Munson of the Home Economics Department of the West Central School and Experiment Station, will demonstrate floral arrangements. Donald Spring of the English Department of the University of Minnesota, Morris, will discuss the importance of good recreational reading in the home.

An old fashioned barbecue dinner will be served at a charge of \$1.00 per plate for the noon meal. The afternoon program, starting at 1:15, will feature William H. Kircher, of the FARMER. Mr. Kircher is the Editor-in-Chief of the FARMER magazine which has been long recognized as an outstanding farm publication in the upper Midwest.
