The Food Shelf is in particular need of healthy soups, cereals, pastas, and juices in addition to hygiene products like toothpaste, soaps, and feminine hygiene products.

How

Why

Last year UMN Morris students gathered more than 1,601 pounds of food and personal hygiene products, as well as \$782.95 in donations. This year, they hope to collect 1,750 pounds of food and \$850 in donations.
