A B C Program Announced

Something new in the way of providing loans and scholarships for college students is being started this fall by farmers in this area.

Sponsored by the Farmers Union in West Central Minnesota in cooperation with the University of Minnesota, Morris, the plan is called "Agricultural Barter for College", or ABC.

As outlined last night (Monday, September 11) at a meeting in Morris of Farmers Union leaders, the program is designed to develop funds to encourage young people to get started at UMM. Since the Morris liberal arts college expects an enrollment this fall almost double that of last year, it is more important than ever that sufficient scholarships and student loans be made available.

Under the ABC plan farmers in the area once a year are consigning farm products such as eggs, poultry, hogs, grain, milk, flax, soybeans, or a portion of any agricultural commodity when it is marketed. At the time of sale the earnings from the chosen product will be sent to UMM for student financial aids.

Heading the project is Donald Frederickson of Murdock. He announced that the goal of the ABC plan is to assure that no student who has the ability and desire to go to college shall be deprived of a college education because of lack of funds.
