### UMM CONCERT TO BE NOVEMBER 28

Music sung in French, Spanish and Latin will be among the diversified selections offered by the University of Minnesota, Morris music department in its first concert of the current academic year.

The choral and orchestral concert will be presented at 8 p.m. Tuesday, November 28, in Edson Hall auditorium on the UMM campus. The entire program is under the direction of Ralph E. Williams, associate professor of music at UMM, who conducts the UMM orchestra and all campus choral groups.

Selections to be sung by the UMM men's chorus and mixed chorus range from a 16th century sacred piece to a rock 'n roll spiritual. A French song telling the story of two gossiping young women discussing their husbands and a composition by Ralph Williams will be sung by the 60-voice mixed chorus.

Sibelius, Norman Luboff and Tchesnokoff will be represented in the numbers offered by the 36-voice men's chorus.

The 50-piece UMM orchestra will include selections by Vivaldi, Strauss, Humperdinck and Tchaikovsky in their program. The group, which made its public debut last May, now has 24 members in the string section with more to be added in the future.

Housewives, businessmen and teachers in both music and academic fields are among the string players who travel to weekly rehearsals in Morris from throughout west central Minnesota including such communities as Alexandria, Benson, Browns Valley, Clinton, Glenwood, Hancock and Ortonville.
